WHY WE EXIST

Every year, millions of children are screened for reading difficulties under new state laws — and most families receive a one-page letter with little guidance on what comes next. Laws exist, but implementation is inconsistent. Rights exist, but most parents don't know them. The guidance exists, but it's buried in jargon written for administrators, not families.

Stridable works in that gap — the space between legislation and lived experience, where families are too often left on their own.

A law on the books is not the same as a child getting the support they need.

HOW WE KEEP IT ACCURATE

Accuracy is the point. We track official sources across our priority states — state departments of education, legislation databases, established advocacy organizations, and peer-reviewed reading research. A person reviews every article and state page before it publishes, checking statute numbers, implementation dates, screener lists, and parent rights against the originals. When sources conflict, we show what each one says rather than paper over it.
